My last pastoral letter to the good people of St. John's United Church of Christ

Pastor's Desk

To all my friends in Christ,

I want to thank all of you for the many ways you allowed me to be your pastor. As the years go by, I will look back fondly on our time together; I trust the same will be true for you. A few years ago we had the pleasure of celebrating our 175th Anniversary. I wonder about the experience of those pastors of who preceded me. I wonder about the people they served? What did their passion for Jesus Christ look like? For eight years I've watched children grow up. I've baptized, performed marriages, performed too many funerals. I've visited hospitals and shut-ins. Together, we realized a few dreams, lived through a few trials, and persevered.

While I am leaving you, there is one who remains constant: Jesus Christ. Jesus has been here from the beginning, and will be with you for the rest of time. If through the power of the Holy Spirit you allow Jesus to guide you, our St. John's Congregation will always have a mission. It may not look like the church we have today. There may be difficult decisions which need to be made. But a passion for our Lord and Savior will see you through all your future trials. This passion guided the earlier congregations of St. John's, a passion which allowed them to navigate their own trials. They managed and flourished; so can we.

The biblical record is full of stories about people who faced harder trials than we. A few times the people of Israel were exiled from their land; every time they returned. When Elijah was on the run from King Ahab and Queen Jezebel he prayed, "I've been very passionate for the LORD God of heavenly forces because the Israelites have abandoned your covenant. They have torn down your altars and they have murdered your prophets with the sword. I'm the only one left, and now they want to take my life too." The LORD heard Elijah's prayer and encouraged him with these words: "I have preserved those who remain in Israel, totaling seven thousand—all those whose knees haven't bowed down to Baal and whose mouths haven't kissed him." When Elijah had done the math it looked to him like it was all over. God's math was different from Elijah's. God made a way where there was no way, and God will do it again for people who



It will be good to hear the sound of little voices in the hallways here. I met the new pre-school director the other day. I am looking forward to the new year of little people.

Vacation this summer for me included a week at the beach. After missing last year, it was so marvelous being part of one of God's great creations. Just the smell of the ocean as you drive nearer and nearer brings it all to you. Early morning walks to the end of the island to discover what the ocean has deposited is one of my most favorite things to do. Of course there were the usual bundles of seaweed and broken shells. After church on Sunday at Caney Creek Baptist Church, we gathered in the picnic pavilion at the church. A young man, Rob working on his bicycle, was sitting there. He watched us unpack lunch and lowered his head when we prayed. We invited him to share lunch with us. He declined lunch, but did enjoy some watermelon. He and his biking partner were biking cross-country and had arrived in Kentucky on Saturday. They had started on the east coast and were headed to Portland. He planned to get there around Labor Day. We sent him on his way with as much fruit as he could carry.

We also stopped at the Dairy Queen. Unfortunately, their dining room was closed due to lack of workers. They took our order and would bring it outside. Suddenly the door opened, and the manager invited us inside if we promised not to tell anyone. Shhhhh.... And when it came time to pay the bill, he discounted the bill. You know, we ask our VBS kids to look for God sightings each day. I

do believe we had two right there in Kentucky.

Last week, as I write this, the Board of Christian Education hosted the first LOL St. John's, Laugh on the Lawn St. John's. The theme was a Luau. We enjoyed pizza and cookies and chips. There was a hula dance, lawn games and a limbo competition. And there was laughter. People of all ages showed up...about 27 of them. Little kids were at baseball and swimming and so, there were more adults than kids, but we had fun. And when the thunder rumbled, clean up happened quickly by all. We beat the rain by minutes. What a great event! We look forward to three more LOLs St. John's.

This past Saturday, I attended the wedding of a young man and woman in Columbus. The young man, Matt, was one of those youth who traveled with us on the Mad Map trips we used to make before Synods, National Youth Events or Regional Youth Events. Matt was a kindergarten teacher and contracted encephalitis. He is now in a wheel chair and probably will be forever. He speaks in "Matt-isms" if he cannot think of the word he wants to say. A mutual friend introduced Matt to Cathleen. When Matt became ill, against the wishes of her parents, Cathleen professed her commitment to Matt. And so they married each other. I was honored to be invited. There was not a dry eye during the wedding. When Matt said his vows he carefully said each word. There was a time when he

could not speak at all. He gets around in a wheelchair. But at the wedding reception, he stood with the help of his walker to do their first dance together. And then, he surprised his mom and danced with her also. (His therapists, who were at the wedding, had worked with him so he could accomplish the standing.) And the tears flowed again with awe at the accomplishments of Matt.

I love to follow the lives of our "kids" as they grow into their lives. Will McCrate has gone off to the Naval Academy in the class of 2025! Kim Deitrick Nagy and her wife have had a brand new little boy. My heart swells with love.

Finally, we will say good-bye to our pastor at the end of July. I must tell you, it will be very difficult for me. We, Tom and I, have not always agreed on things. But I have felt so much support from him and shared so much laughter with him and the staff. He has had lots of fun ideas and ways to get the congregation involved in the life of the church. I wish both he and Patty the best in their new congregation and home.

In Kentucky, we were asked where we had seen Jesus. Where was there proof of God? People and friends using the Blessing Box and coming to FLOCK. The waves and animals on the beach. The beautiful sunsets at night. A random bicyclist. An understanding and kind DQ manager. The fellowship and laughter on our front lawn. A new baby of one of our own "kids". An appoint-

ment to one of the military academies to another. The laughter of friends on the front lawn. A wedding miracle, in many ways. And a man who taught me a bit about myself. Jesus? Proof of God? Pick a day. I have been surrounded so many times this summer, and the summer is not over yet. I look forward to what more is to come. Amen.


XOO will begin again on Wednesdays beginning on **September 1**. A schedule will be posted in mid-August.

**St. John's UCC Church Council Meeting
July 13, 2021 at 7:30pm Hybrid Meeting (In person and Zoom)**

The meeting of St. John's United Church of Christ Church Council was called to order on July 13, 2021 at 7:30 pm by President Dan Dummermuth. There were 18 members in attendance including Rev. Tom Dunkle and Pastor Dotty Hartzell.

Rev. Dunkle offered an opening prayer.

The minutes of the June 2021 meeting were approved as emailed to council members.

Treasurer Dave Gingrich gave the treasurer's report. General Fund Income for June was \$19,074 and Expenses were \$27,623 resulting in a shortfall of \$8,549 for the month. General Fund Income year-to-date is \$139,421 with Expenses year-to-date of \$187,903 resulting in a year-to-date shortfall of \$48,482. In addition to General Fund Expenses, \$25,320 has been disbursed for the floor tile repair project. M/S/C by Rob Gump and Adam Herman to approve the treasurer's report.

SENIOR MINISTER REPORT- no report

PASTOR OF VISITATION REPORT- Pastor Dotty reported she has started home visits. The Christmas in July Flip Flop Project will be taking donations until July 22nd. At that time, the items will be placed on a

clothes line on the front lawn for those who are in need. There are two funerals Pastor Dotty will be officiating. She continues to send weekly mailings to home bound members.

DIRECTOR OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION- Belinda Lentz reported she is busy planning for Sunday School that will resume this fall. She continues to communicate with the children and youth group. Weekly children's sermons will be recorded and posted on social media, until fall. Laugh Out Loud (LOL) Wednesday evening's activities during the month of July started last week. It was a great time with 27 in attendance.

MARK PERRY REPORT- Dave Gingrich reported for Mark, the corner building renovation is proceeding. The underground plumbing is complete and the concrete work is moving forward. There have been a few delays in receiving materials but the project completion is still on target for September.

With the building renovations to be completed, Pastor Dotty suggested a committee be formed to discuss the many possible uses of the community center. Any member who would be interested in being on the committee should let President Dan know.

BOARD REPORTS

ELDERS REPORT- Vicki Ruffener reviewed the communion schedule. Reverend Dunkle has completed the Master Worship Calendar for the year. This will be helpful to the new Interim Pastor Jeffrey Jackson who will start on August 9th. Jean Paddock worked with Dave Gingrich on the stewardship letter.

DEACONS REPORT - Beth Showers asked for communion servers for July 25th. The preferred seating boards and signs used during the pandemic, have been removed. Council feels our members will continue to social distance on their own, at Sunday morning church. There was discussion on opening the nursery during church services. A decision will be made at a later date.

TRUSTEES REPORT Rob Gump reported for the Trustees.

Tile Project- The tile project is underway. Installation has been completed from the choir room down the steps. This project will take time to complete as there has been issues with crumbling concrete under the old tile. The new tile is beautiful.

Roof Repairs- The water damage in the bell choir / 4H room was caused by roof issues. The roof has been repaired by Miller Roofing. Koon Construction will seal and waterproof the outside wall. When the outside wall sealing is complete the Trustees will move on to the interior plaster repairs.

Outside Light- Wood Electric fixed the outside light by the east parking lot and put in LED lighting.

Custodian Position- Rob reported on the hiring issues for a new part time custodian. This is a 30 hour position. Council discussed this at length. At this time, it is very difficult to find the right person for this position. There will be an all-out effort to get the position filled by the time the preschool starts in September.

Sue Ferbrache requested future funds be allocated for landscaping upkeep. Several church members have been doing all of the work and it is a big job to handle.

Treasurer Dave Gingrich reported that there is a line item in the budget for Property Maintenance, which

includes landscaping.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION- Amanda Jeffrey has been hired as the new Preschool Director.

OLD BUSINESS

President Dan updated Council on the hiring of new Interim Minister Jeffrey Jackson. Reverend Jackson will start on August 9th with his first church service on August 15th. Reverend Jackson currently is in a part time position in Hiram, Ohio. As a veteran interim pastor, Reverend Jackson has experience with starting contemporary services and church community centers. Welcome Reverend Jeffrey Jackson.

NEW BUSINESS

M/S/C by Dave Gingrich and Rob Gump to extend a \$500 stipend each to technology coordinator Heather Smith and part-time custodian Glen Bleinger for the additional outstanding work they have done for our church. This stipend is to be paid in July.

M/S/C by Dave Gingrich and Sue Ferbrache to gift Reverend Dunkle the laptop computer he has been using on behalf of the church.

ADJOURNMENT AND LORD'S PRAYER

President Dan led the council in the Lord's Prayer and the meeting was adjourned at 8:35pm.
